

SEXUAL ASSAULT NURSE EXAMINER

A SANE is a registered nurse who has received advanced education and training regarding sexual assault and forensic nursing. SANE-trained nurses must follow specific protocols in the care and examination of sexual assault victims to preserve evidence and ensure chain of custody. SANEs complete a medicolegal examination, collect and preserve evidence, apply critical thinking skills and are considered expert witnesses in the judicial system.

CONTINUING EDUCATION

This program will award up to 42 contact hours to participants completing the self-study, five-day SANE Training and course evaluation.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This training will follow the 40-hour 2015 International Association of Forensic Nurses guidelines for the Adult/Adolescent Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners (SANE). To sit for the SANE certification exam, a nurse must complete the entire SANE Training (self-study plus five-day training), as well as clinical requirements outlined by the International Association of Forensic Nurses, which will be discussed during the training. USI program staff will monitor and provide documentation of completion of clinical requirements. Licensure will be verified.

SELF-STUDY PRIOR TO TRAINING

Nurses enrolled in the five-day SANE Training also must complete an online self-study prior to the training. Access to online instruction materials will be provided to nurses who register for all five days. Submission of completed materials is required by March 1, prior to attendance at the training starting on March 6.
