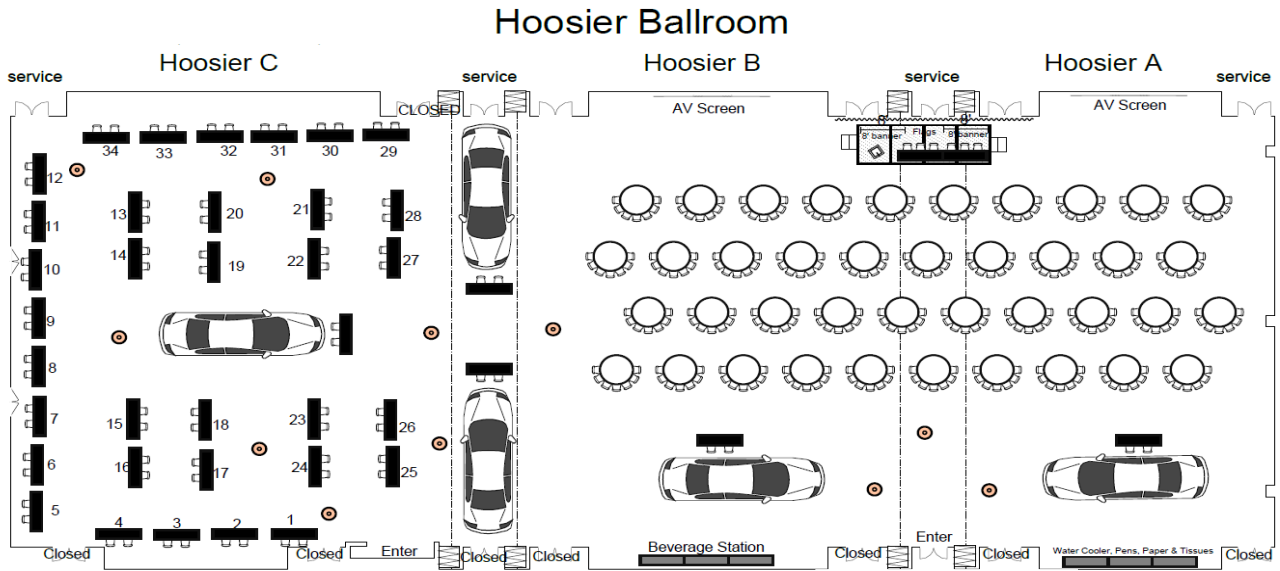

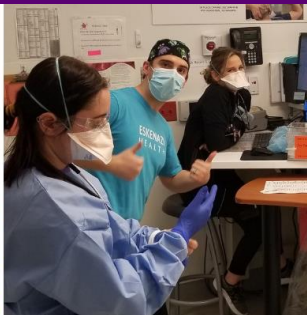
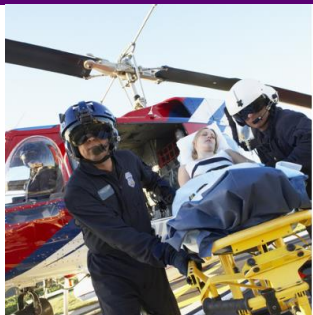

EMS: Average Leaders Put Up With It, Great Leaders Have A Passion for it!

The positive traits of a leader are often defined by their values, passion for what they do, and their ability to see things that others don't.

Chief Rick Lasky (ret.), a 40-plus year veteran of the fire service, served as chief of the Lewisville (TX) Fire Department for 12 years, prior to that as Fire Chief in Coeur d'Alene Idaho. Rick followed in his father's footsteps, beginning his career as a firefighter in the suburbs on the southwest side of Chicago. In Illinois, he received the 1996 International Society of Fire Service Instructors "Innovator of the Year" award for his part in developing the "Saving Our Own" program. He served as the co-lead instructor for the H.O.T. Firefighter Survival program at FDIC for over ten years, is a long-standing editorial advisory board member for Fire Engineering Magazine, and serves on the FDIC advisory board. Rick is the author of the best-selling books "Pride & Ownership: A Firefighter's Love of the Job" and "Five Alarm Leadership: From the Firehouse to the Fireground" published by Fire Engineering Books & Videos and is the co-host of the podcast "The Command Post" heard on FireEngineering.com as well as the podcast "Old School" heard on iTunes.
